

Dr. Jerome Sheridan is the director of American University's Brussels Center and a professor of international relations. Since coming to Brussels in 1991, he has developed, directed, and taught a number of specialized academic programs on the European Union and NATO for students coming from American University in Washington, DC. He also serves as a lecturer at the Netherlands Defence College, and is a frequent guest lecturer for various European and American audiences on transatlantic relations, the European Union's Common Security and Defense Policy, and NATO. He is a member of the board of the Fulbright Commission and of the selection committee for the Fulbright-Schuman Scholarship.

Outside of academia, Dr. Sheridan is the president of the American Overseas Memorial Day Association in Belgium. He is a past-president of Lions Club Ijsedal Tervuren, and a member of the executive board of the Transatlantic Council of the Boy Scouts of America. He is an active member of several other community service, cultural, and professional organizations.

Dr. Sheridan graduated with honors from the University of Notre Dame and earned his doctorate in economics from American University. He has taught at American University's London Semester Program, and on the main campus in Washington, DC. He has also worked as a part-time legislative aid for a member of the United States Congress, and he has taught at the University of Notre Dame. Dr. Sheridan and his family live in Teruvren, Belgium. He is dual-national, trilingual, and an avid amateur mountaineer.
