

TAMI GOUVEIA, CLASS OF 1996, we honor you today with the Alumnae Achievement Award. This award is presented to alumnae whose accomplishments and service to society exemplify the values and virtues set forth by the College.

Tami, you have been dedicated to bettering the community around you since your time on campus when Mount Holyoke bestowed upon you the Maurice L. Rabbino Award for recognition as a student "who has made an especially significant contribution to the life of Mount Holyoke College."

Since then, your energy, vision, and leadership have enabled you to make a visible impact in all that you do. As the director of programs at the Northeast Center for Healthy Communities in Lawrence, Massachusetts, you improve operations, expanded programs and services, and launched a coalition for partners, securing \$1 million in funding to support substance abuse prevention initiatives.

In 2013 you were named executive director of the Massachusetts statewide advocacy organization Tobacco Free Mass, where you worked to obtain funding and provide programs to prevent tobacco use and addiction and helped college campuses across New England go tobacco free. For your work, you were honored by the Massachusetts Public Health Association as the recipient of the Alfred Frechette Award, presented to an "outstanding individual under the age of forty who demonstrates unwavering passion for public health and exceptional leadership."
