ELEANOR G. ROGAN, CLASS OF 1963, the Alumnae Association of Mount Holyoke College is pleased to honor you with the Achievement Award. This award is presented to alumnae whose accomplishments and service to society exemplify the values and virtues set forth by the College.

Eleanor, you have been a pioneer in the field of biochemistry as a highly respected educator and groundbreaking researcher focusing on women's health concerns.

With a United States Public Health Service Fellowship, you earned a doctorate in biochemistry from the Johns Hopkins University in 1968 and spent a year teaching at Goucher College. After completing postdoctoral work at the University of Tennessee, you were recruited by the University of Nebraska, where you have served with distinction in a number of roles. In 2007 you were appointed chair of the Department of Environmental, Agricultural, and Occupational Health, a position you hold to this day. You have been a principal or co-investigator on twenty-one grants and have published more than two hundred papers on research involving environmental health and cancer prevention. For your contributions to the growth of the University of Nebraska College of Public Health, and for your excellence as an educator, you have received many honors, including a 2010 Excellence in Teaching Award and a 2017 Chancellor Robert D. Sparks Award in Public Health and Preventive Medicine. You say your role model, Anna Jane Harrison, chair of Mount Holyoke College's chemistry department while you were a student, "set very high standards and showed that women could be successful in science." Professor Harrison would no doubt be proud of all you have accomplished.
